Suresh Singh Bhadoria has been a pioneer of medical education in Madhya Pradesh and his state-of-the-art hospitals played a key role in controlling the pandemic and ensuring long-term patient care

SURESH SINGH Bhadoria, a well-known personality in Madhya Pradesh, is the chairman of the Index Group of Institutions, Indore and Amaltas Group of Institutions, Dewas. He has been into the healthcare and medical education sector over the last two decades. His medical institutions have an annual intake of 400 MBBS seats at two of his medical colleges and have more than 150 MD/MS PG seats in Indore and Dewas. At present, the Index Medical College is the only medical college in Central India having an annual quota of 250 MBBS seats and is now on the road to super-specialty medical courses like MCH and DM. Diploma, graduation and post-graduation courses are already running successfully in his dental college, nursing colleges, physiotherapy and paramedical colleges and pharmacy colleges. The Index Group of institutions runs under the aegis of the Malwanchal University.

Bhadoria considers his late mother as his highest source of inspiration who unfortunately lost her battle to cancer due to lack of advanced medicines and modern equipment at that time. He then set his best foot forward in the medical education and hospital sector to build modern, state-of-the-art hospitals with the highest quality infrastructure which would enable the common people to avail medical facilities at a minimum cost.

Since 2020, particularly the COVID-19 pandemic, both Index Hospital and Amaltas Hospital were dedicated to the treatment of Corona patients 24x7. A total of 1,100 beds of Index Hospital and 550 beds of Amaltas Hospital were authorised by the Madhya Pradesh Government for the treatment of

COVID-19 patients. The necessary medical facilities and treatment were provided to COVID-19 and mucormycosis patients as per internationally approved treatment protocols. Free medicines and free treatment facilities were given to these patients. The doctors, nurses, paramedical staff and all the supporting staff of both his hospitals selflessly rendered their services during these challenging times. Bhadoria's hospitals treated more than 53,000 COVID-19 patients during both the waves with minimum mortality rate.

In his own words, "The Government administrative system provided us complete unhindered support for the treatment of COVID-19 as well as Black Fungus patients. We also provided physiotherapy, yoga and

counselling to patients as well as their families to boost their morale which helped them develop their will to heal. The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh, Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan ji, and Collector Shri Manish Singh ji extended their support in these difficult times under the able leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji, and it is commendable that under such leadership we were able to combat this pandemic successfully. We consider it our duty and privilege that our hospitals participated in the vaccination drives under recommended safety measures successfully and enthusiastically.
